

II. Background of the College with Vision, Mission and Objectives.

Sri Ramakrishna Degree College, Nandyal, Andhra Pradesh, sponsored by Sri Ramakrishna Education Society, was established in the year 1984. All the activities of the college are planned and executed keeping in view, their mission and objectives.

The mission to provide top class higher learning facilities at Nandyal, which has been, till then, was starving for a well-knit educational institution that could offer quality education in different faculties, led to the establishment of Sri Ramakrishna Degree College in 1984. The College was then affiliated to Sri Venkateshwara University, Tirupathi and subsequently transferred to Sri Krishnadevaraya University, Anantapur due to reorganization of boundaries of these Universities by the State of Andhra Pradesh. The latest round of reorganization of the boundaries of the Universities has brought our college under Rayalaseema University, Kurnool.

Sri Ramakrishna Degree College is offering 11 Under Graduate and 8 PG courses

In recognition of its excellent services in the field of education the institution has received many Laurels from different quarters. During the year 1996, the College was admitted to grant-in-aid by the Government of Andhra Pradesh. The college got a shot in its arm when the UGC granted autonomous status to it during the academic year 2005-06. Another feather was added to its cap, when the college was identified as a college with potential for excellence (CPE) by the UGC. Since 2005-06 the college has been functioning under autonomous status.

The college is accredited by NAAC with "A" grade in 2006-07. The College is reaccredited at "A" grade by NAAC in 2015.

The Autonomous status conferred on the college gave academic flexibility and intellectual freedom to design its own curricula, of course with certain limitations.

The college was conferred autonomous status in 2005-2006. The college got extension of autonomous status from 2011-2012 to 2016-2017. Now the college is undergoing visit for extension of autonomous status from 2017-2018 onwards.

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The college encourages the students to participate in NCC, NSS, Sports & Games, intellectual activities such as debates & seminars and cultural activities such as poetry, music, dance and painting.

U.G. Programmes:

The admissions are based on the academic record of the candidate in the qualifying examination. Rule of reservation as stipulated by the Government of Andhra Pradesh is followed. Students seeking admissions are counseled before the admission in the selection of courses.

P.G. Programmes:

Admission is done by the parent university through an Admission Test and a Centralized Counseling.

M. Phil. And Ph.D Programmes:

Candidates are selected by the Parent University on the basis of their performance in the RE-CET and are allotted to the registered Research Guides in the College.

The college also offers fee concessions to differently - abled students, students engaged in sports and students from socially disadvantaged classes.

Students from the other universities have to submit eligibility, migration and transfer certificates for all these courses.

	<p>The College implemented the semester system from the year 2005 i.e. on conferment of the Autonomous Status. With the grant of autonomy, the college has thoroughly revised the student Evaluation System. The aim is to base student Evaluation through continuous Assessment and bring down the emphasis laid on the Terminal Assessment. Ideally, the college likes to give equal weightage to Formative Assessment and Summative Assessment. Currently the weightage distribution is 40% for Formative Assessment and 60% for Summative Assessment in each subject. The Formative Assessment is based on a number of criteria such as performance in the Internal Assessment Tests, Seminars, Quizzes, Assignments and Attendance.</p>

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The weightage for each criterion is as follows.

Internal Assessment (30%)

The college, in due course, would like to increase the weightage for the Formative Assessment and finally change over to Choice Based Credit System.

In a semester, teachers take five assignments per paper, which can be in the form of written tests, project work, visit report, paper presentation, exhibition work, practical work or fieldwork. Each student receives a feedback on each of his/her assignment, and then the teacher further guides him/her for the next assignment.

The other reforms adopted are listed below:

- Verification of marks and revaluation of answer sheets (on student's request)
- Issuing a photocopy of the answer book (on student's request)
- Declaration of results within three weeks after the completion of examination

At the college level, the following initiatives have been taken:

- Centralized examination with two controllers of examination.
- Common paper setting for all mediums.
- Coding of question papers and answer scripts for maintaining confidentiality.
- Preparing 02 sets of question papers (Either set is selected for the exam.).
- Moderation of answer sheets.
- Simultaneous result declaration of all the streams.
- 05 marks awarded as part of the internal assessment if a student has more than 90% attendance.

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Based on the visit to various departments, interaction with the Management, Faculty, Students, and Non-teaching staff the committee makes the following observations and suggestions.

XVII. Observations of the Committee

- (1) The College has good Infrastructure.
- (2) The class rooms and laboratories are well equipped
- (3) Girl's hostel facility and canteen facility are good.
- (4) Sports Infrastructure facilities are excellent.
- (5) The college follows the rules and regulations of UGC & University.
- (6) The college has green environment.
- (7) The college has strong NCC and NSS unit
- (8) The management is committed to lot of Social activities like adoption of villages, providing financial support to Orphan students, Blind students, old age home etc.,

XVIII. Suggestions of the Committee

- (1) More training is required for the students to improve and harness their skills.
- (2) The Library of the college may be digitalized.
- (3) The college may take up the issue of admitting Ph.D students with the University/ State Govt so that the research atmosphere is created in the college.
- (4) The teachers may be encouraged to take up more Research Projects with the financial assistance from various funding agencies. They may also be encouraged to attend and organize seminars & workshops.
- (5) The college may introduce On line Courses in MOOC's (SWAYAM) modules.
- (6) The college may request UGC to nominate its nominee in Governing Body.
- (7) The college may establish a Councelling Centre to mitigate the problem of suicide of the farmers as part of their regular NSS activity as there are more farmers suicide in Nandyal as reported by the college.

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
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
- (8) Industry-Institution Interaction cell be set up for the purpose of professional growth of the students.

- (11) Efforts to be made to fill the vacant teaching and non-teaching positions in Grant-in-Aid.


XIX. Recommendations of the Committee




